
#### Sign Language

Sir Jonathan Ive is the designer of many of Apple's products, including the MacBook Pro, iMac, MacBook Air, Mac mini, iPod, iPod Touch, iPhone, iPad, iPad Mini and the Apple Watch. He did some of his training in our region!

Jonathan's father was a silversmith who taught at University, he said, "Dad's a fantastic craftsman, his Christmas gift to me would be one day of his time in his college workshop, during the Christmas break when no one else was there, helping me make whatever I dreamed up".

During his high school years, Jonathan was passionate about cars, and it was this interest that led to his later career as a designer. He explored the option of studying car design in London at the Royal College of Art, however, he encountered a learning environment that was off-putting: "The classes were full of students making vroom! vroom! noises as they drew".

Jonathan studied **Industrial Design** at **Northumbria University in Newcastle**. Here he played with ideas, designing, inventing and problem solving. He had been interested in drawing and making anything he could think of since he was a teenager, and now he had the opportunity to build, test and present his ideas. No one could have imagined how successful he would become.

While a student, Jonathan found using Apple Mac computers difficult.

So he redesigned them.

Now he is possibly the most influential designer in the World.
