The Queen and Prince Philip celebrate 70 years of marriage

The bells of Westminster Abbey in London, where the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh married in 1947, rang to mark the occasion on the 20th November.

They are the first royal couple to celebrate their 70th wedding anniversary. When they married, the then Princess Elizabeth was 21 years old while her groom, Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten, was 26.

Just two years after the Second World War, Britain was still recovering from the Blitz and rationing was in effect for everyone, even the royal family. The Queen saved up clothing coupons to purchase her ivory satin wedding gown. A thrifty Princess Elizabeth also did her own make-up on her wedding day.

The couple were married in front of 2,000 invited guests. The ceremony was broadcast on radio, to 200 million listeners worldwide.

More than 2,500 wedding presents arrived from around the world, and 10,000 telegrams of congratulations.

The couple went to Buckingham Palace after the ceremony where they waved to large crowds from the balcony.

The official wedding cake was 9ft tall and was made by McVities and Price. Eleven other cakes were given as presents. With post-war food rationing still in

place ingredients were sent as wedding presents from overseas, for example the official cake was made using ingredients given as a wedding gift by Australian Girl Guides. Pieces of cake and food parcels were later distributed to schoolchildren and institutions.

The grave of the Unknown Warrior was the only stone that was not covered by the special carpet in the Abbey. The day after the wedding, Princess Elizabeth followed a Royal tradition started by her mother, of sending her wedding bouquet back to the Abbey to be laid on this grave.

The royal couple celebrated their platinum wedding anniversary with a private dinner with family and friends at Windsor Castle.

YOUNG SPORTS PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR...

Meet the 10 stars who are in the running for 2017's Young Sports Personality of the Year award

16 year-old para-athlete

Kare Adenegan competes in the T34 wheelchair races. She picked up silver in the 100m and bronzes in the 400m and 800m at the World Para-athletics Championships in London

17 year-old footballer

Rhian Brewster plays for the England Under-17 team and in this year's World Cup he won the Golden Boot for the tournament's top scorer. He also scored the opening goal for his team in the final - which they won

18 year-old gymnast

Ellie Downie became the first Brit to win all-around gold at a major international event - the European Championships. She won two silvers in the vault and floor and bronze in the uneven bars at the event too.

18 year-old cricketer

Sophie Ecclestone was chosen for the England's Women's Ashes squad in Australia where she was one of the best bowlers for the team. She also played for Lancashire Thunder in the Women's Super League.

17 year-old footballer

Phil Foden plays for the England Under-17 team and in this year's World Cup he won the Golden Ball for the tournament's best player. He also scored twice in the final - which they won!

18 year-old canoeist

Ieuan James won gold in the K1 200m European Junior Championships and World Junior Championships. He is the first Brit to become World Junior Champion in 22 years.

18 year-old para-skier

Millie Knight won downhill gold at the World Para-alpine Skiing Championships. It was the first world title for a British Para-skier, and she also won silvers in the giant slalom, slalom and super combined events.

18 year-old rugby union player

Marcus Smith is usually the number 10 at his Premiership club, Harlequins. After playing really well for his team he got chosen for the England squad for the autumn international series.

17 year-old para-archer

Jess Stretton won two gold medals at the World Para-archery Championships - one for the W1 pairs, which she won with partner John Cavanagh, and the second for the individual title, beating fellow Brit Jo Frith.

18 year-old footballer

Ben Woodburn scored the winning goal for Wales in their World Cup qualifying match over Austria. It was the first time he'd played in the senior team for his country and that goal made him Wales' second youngest scorer after Gareth Bale.

Last year, swimmer Ellie Robinson won the prize. This year, the top three finalists will be announced on Blue Peter on Thursday, 7 December, and the overall winner will be presented with their trophy during the Sports Personality TV show on BBC One on 17 December.
